

Pray for the Wrights MISSIONARIES TO GREENLAND

June and July 2018,

We arrived in Ilulissat on Friday, July 13th, to join the only other Baptist missionary in Greenland. Our flight went smoothly with only a slight delay due to fog. We got a little nervous as we learned that our flight ticket regulations were different from one flight to the next. We thought we had everything figured out but realized we overlooked Air Greenland's weight restrictions. We were shocked as we learned that to bring all of our extra luggage with us was going to cost an extra \$1000. We did not have that extra to spend. We prayed and asked the Lord for mercy and favor from the attendant. We watched the Lord work a miracle right before our eyes. The attendant allowed all of our extra bags on the plane without costing us any extra money. Praise the Lord!

We are grateful to work with the Shulls as we start our ministry here in Greenland. Having been on the field for ten years, they have figured out much of what would have taken us days possibly months to get started here. We have gotten many things set up already, including our legal paperwork to live and work as a missionary, but we still are awaiting housing. The housing market is good here in Ilulissat. Houses move quickly whether renting or buying. We are currently staying at the church, but please continue to pray that God would open the door for our housing.

There is a strong presence of Danish and Greenlandic spoken here without the hint of either dying anytime soon. It is a struggle and things go much slower for everything we attempt to do just because of the language barrier, currency, and metric system. For example, we purchased Hjortetaksalt (translated deer antler salt) thinking it was yeast. I can hear you laughing from here, but this is some of what we have faced since being here for the past week in a strange land with different sounds and faces. It is an adventure to live in a new culture, but we also realize that it will not be an easy task. If I could just focus on one language, maybe it would be simpler. However, I am constantly thrown words from both languages, with different phonetic and grammar rules as we shop and meet new faces in town. Our end goal is to learn Greenlandic with the intention of an indigenous church plant in another village, but we know it will not come without its challenges. We long for the day the unfamiliar becomes familiar, and we can share the familiar gospel story to unfamiliar faces.

The family is doing well. They are having fun with the Shull family, taking various hikes and playing games. Please continue to pray for them as they adjust to their new "home" and surroundings.
